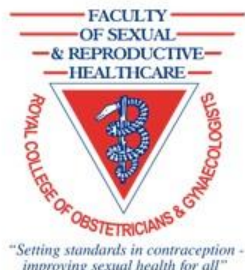




Sexual & Reproductive Healthcare e-learning

An e-learning resource supporting the training of doctors and nurses in sexual and reproductive healthcare



e-SRH is the Sexual & Reproductive Healthcare (SRH) e-learning project which was developed in partnership between the Faculty of Sexual

& Reproductive Healthcare (FSRH) and e-Learning for Healthcare. The FSRH is a Faculty of the Royal College of Obstetricians & Gynaecologists, and is committed to supporting healthcare professionals to acquire the relevant knowledge and competences for delivering quality Sexual & Reproductive Healthcare in community settings.

The e-SRH curriculum was developed to reflect the level of knowledge required by a doctor or nurse delivering non-specialist SRH care in a community setting at Level 1 and some elements of Level 2 care, in line with the National Strategies for Sexual Health. It provides a sound basis for the clinician to gain clinical competence. There is a range of modules designed to match the needs of a variety of healthcare professionals including those working in gynaecology, sexual health, most GPs and Practice Nurses. Additionally some modules are relevant to school nurses, pharmacists, health visitors and midwives. For doctors and nurses, e-SRH may be used for the knowledge component for the Diploma in Sexual & Reproductive Healthcare. The e-KA (e-Knowledge Assessment) is based on the content of e-SRH.

The online material has been written and extensively peer reviewed by a multidisciplinary team of medical and nursing clinical experts in Sexual & Reproductive Healthcare, Genitourinary Medicine and General Practice.

The comprehensive curriculum includes:

- Contraception, including modules specifically on LARC (long acting reversible contraception)
- Sexually transmitted infections
- National Chlamydia Screening Programme
- National Cervical Screening Programme
- Planning pregnancy
- Early pregnancy assessment including referral for abortion
- Recognising psychosexual problems
- Providing SRH care for young people
- The law relating to confidentiality, sexual activity and provision of healthcare to young people
